Leadership Beaufort

Established in 1985, Leadership Beaufort is a 9-month, cohort-based community immersion program. Selected participants get a holistic view of the region and learn how to make a difference.

Senior Leadership

MILITARY

The Beaufort region is home to three military installations Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort, Marine Corps Recruit Depot
Parris Island, and Naval Hospital Beaufort – which house multiple
training and force readiness missions that are vital to national
defense. Combined, the installations generate \$2.5 billion annually
in economic activity annually and support nearly 20,000 people.

The Military Enhancement Committee (MEC) of Beaufort County works with community and government partners to sustain and enhance the quality and value of the military installations of Beaufort County. The MEC is comprised of nine voting members appointed by public and private entities from around the region.
